Housing

Men's and women's basketball, cross-country, golf, track and field, volleyball, and water polo, plus men's baseball, and women's soccer, softball, and tennis comprise Division I intercollegiate sports at CSULB. In addition, intramural sports are archery, crew, cycling, ice hockey, martial arts, rugby, sailing, skiing, soccer, and water skiing. Many club sports are available to all students, including, but not limited to, Aikido and other martial arts, triathlon, bowling, and crew.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Seven academic colleges** plus Interdisciplinary Studies offer degrees at the bachelors and masters level. CSULB currently offers 80 baccalaureate degrees (208 programs), 66 masters degrees (98 programs), one joint doctoral degree with the Claremont Colleges in Engineering & Industrial Applied Mathematics, and one joint Ed.D. with University of California, Irvine in Educational Administration and Leadership. In addition, CSULB offers 69 minors, 53 concurrent and postbaccalaureate certificate programs, and 37 programs leading to educational credentials.

DEGREES GRANTED

Since 1950, CSULB has awarded a total of 173,876 baccalaureate degrees, including 5,055 awarded in 2002-2003. Since 1951 CSULB has awarded a total of 35,829 master's degrees, including 892 in 2002-2003.

LIBRARY

Academic programs at CSULB are supported by University Library and Learning Resources. As of October, 2002, the Library possessed:

1,469,280 volumes
1,489,266 microforms
27,573 non-book materials
3,908 unduplicated periodical subscriptions (print),
3,982 titles (electronic)

COAST, (the library's online catalog) averages more than 7,000 searches a day, which retrieve almost 1,400,000 records. In 2002-2003, 273,638 items circulated and 115,053 items were used in-house.

CAMPUS

The CSULB campus encompasses a total of 323 acres with 84 permanent buildings (4,266,853 square feet).

There are more than 149 acres of landscaping, with 75 acres of grass, over 80 species of ornamental plants, and more than 40 varieties of trees, at least 10,000 in all, highlighted by over 2000 Helen Borcher (*prunus persica*) flowering peach trees-the pride of the campus.

Finally, there are over 100 acres of parking and parking facilities, with more than 10,000 parking spaces.
