### Housing

2538 students live in university housing. This includes 1962 students living in 18 buildings on the main campus, 576 students living in 2 buildings at the Residential Learning College, our off-site location and in the International House, where 88 international students and U.S. students room together.

### Sports

Men's and women's basketball, cross-country, golf, track and field, volleyball, and water polo, plus men's baseball, and women's soccer, softball, and tennis comprise Division I intercollegiate sports at CSULB. In addition, intramural sports are archery, crew, cycling, ice hockey, martial arts, rugby, sailing, skiing, soccer, and water skiing. Many club sports are available to all students, including, but not limited to, aikido and other martial arts, triathlon, bowling, lacrosse, surfing roller hockey and crew.

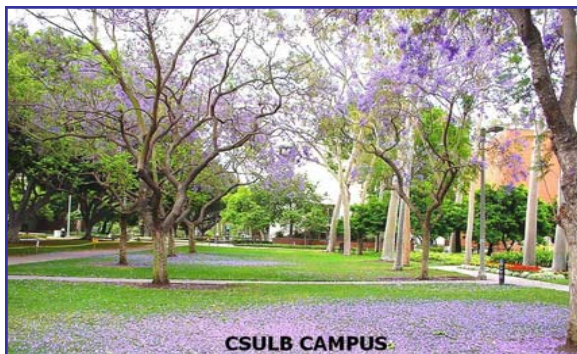

## ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Seven academic colleges\*\* plus Interdisciplinary Studies offer degrees at the bachelors and masters level. CSULB currently offers 85 baccalaureate degrees (139 programs), 64 masters degrees (92 programs), one joint doctoral degree with the Claremont Colleges in Engineering & Industrial Applied Mathematics, and Ed.D. in Educational Leadership. In addition, CSULB offers 71 minors, 51 concurrent, and post-baccalaureate certificate program, and 18 programs leading to educational credentials.

### DEGREES GRANTED

Since 1950, CSULB has awarded a total of 223,721 baccalaureate degrees, including 6,746 awarded in 2010-2011. Since 1951 CSULB has awarded a total of 47,1010 master's degrees, including 1,816 in 2010-2011. In addition, 26 doctoral degrees were granted in 2010-2011.

### CAMPUS

The CSULB campus encompasses a total of 322 acres with 105 permanent buildings (5,101,896 square feet).

There are more than 149 acres of landscaping, with 75 acres of grass, over 80 species of ornamental plants and more than 40 varieties of trees at least 10,000 in all, highlighted by over 2,000 Helen Borcher flowering peach trees, donated by the citizens of Long Beach.

We currently have 20 surface lots and 3 parking structures on campus. There are a total of 13,923 spaces on campus with 10,398 of those being for general parking and 2,112 set aside for Faculty Staff parking.
